SUBJECT: Approve Agreement for the Streetlight Repainting Project for Cobblestone Subdivision CSA66C and authorize Chair to execute.

Recommendation

Public Works staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve contractor services agreement between Yuba County and Streetlight Restoration Specialists for the streetlight repainting project Cobblestone Subdivision CSA 66C, and authorize Chair to execute.

Background

The Cobblestone Subdivision CSA 66C was formed via resolution 2006-140. The CSA is unique in that its streetlights are owned and maintained by the county. They also have enhanced landscaping and decorative street signs. Because of their unique needs they pay a higher assessment than other CSAs. The higher assessments helps to offset the augmented maintenance cost associated with their unique streetlights, street signs and landscaping. Along with all the other standard services provided to the CSA.

Residents of the CSA reached out to Public Work staff with concerns about the appearance of the streetlights and signs within the CSA. While all streetlights are functional, some of the paint is chipped and faded due to wear and tear over the years.

Discussion

Staff performed an analysis of the streetlights and signs, it was determined that they needed to be repainted. It has been some time since the streetlights were installed, during that time a new durable epoxy paint has been developed. The benefits of the epoxy paint is that it will be more resilient to the elements and therefore last longer than traditional paint.

After a thorough bid process, Streetlight Restoration Services, Inc. was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. There are four styles of streetlight and sign poles within the CSA and the cost to prep, prime and paint varies based on the pole style. There are a total of 240 streetlights and street poles that will be upgraded to the epoxy paint.
