SUBJECT: Community Development and Services: Ordinance - Hold Public Hearing, Waive Second Reading, and Adopt Ordinance Amending Sections of Chapter 2.41 - Office of the County Hearing Officer, of Title II of the Yuba County Ordinance Code. (Roll Call Vote) (Ten Minute Estimate)

RECOMMENDATION: We hereby request that the Yuba County Board of Supervisors waive second reading and adopt an ordinance amending certain sections of Chapter 2.41 of the Yuba County Ordinance Code.

BACKGROUND: On November 28, 2023, Ordinance 1621 was passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors. Ordinance 1621 created Chapter 2.41 of the Yuba County Ordinance Code and established the Office of the County Hearing Officer.

DISCUSSION: Subsequent to the adoption of Ordinance 1621, staff began the initial process of implementation as well as exploring the appointment of the County Hearing Officer. Further review of the authorizing statute found that some of the provisions contained in the recently adopted Ordinance were not fully aligned with the State's statute. As such, modifications have been drafted for the Board's consideration. The proposed amendments remove unnecessary and burdensome requirements contained in the first version. Language is added to create additional candidate opportunities, as well as to clarify the terms of employment.

A Hearing Officer shall continue to serve until his or her successor has been duly appointed and qualified. 2. A Hearing Officer who is in the process of hearing a matter when the Hearing Officer's term expires, however, shall continue to discharge the duties as a Hearing Officer for the matter until the matter is completed. A Hearing Officer may be appointed to successive terms. B. An employee appointed as a County Hearing Officer shall not have a term of office, but shall serve as an at-will employee of the Office of the County Administrator. C. An attorney appointed for an Ad Hoc matter, or who is under contract for an individual matter shall not have a term of office, but shall serve as an independent contractor.
2.41.060. A. - C.	ADD: The term of office of each Hearing Officer shall be based on their appointment. A Hearing Officer who is in the process of hearing a matter shall continue to carry out their duties as a Hearing Officer for that matter until the matter is complete. Exception: The County may, at its discretion, terminate a Hearing Officer's duties to preside over any matter pursuant to sections 2.41.050. or 2.41.080. A. An attorney appointed pursuant to an employment contract shall serve as an at-will employee of the Office of the County Administrator and shall commence on the day of his or her appointment. 1. A Hearing Officer may be appointed to successive terms. B. An attorney appointed for an Ad Hoc matter, or who is under contract for an individual matter shall not have a term of office, but shall serve as an independent contractor. C. An attorney who has been hired as an employee of the County shall not have a term of office, but shall carry out the duties as required by the class specification and the appointing authority.
